
# melanoma. patients australia

## A nurses role in supporting patients experiencing inequities and complexities of a RARE melanoma

Mucosal melanoma represents less than 1% of melanoma cases. These patients experience complex physiological symptoms, high psychological needs, a poor prognosis and is associated with inequities including limited treatment options, no optimal care pathway and a lack of dedicated information and support. A nurse-led initiative was established in response to inequities and unmet needs reported by Australians with mucosal melanoma.


## Project

In response to feedback from patients living with mucosal melanoma, Melanoma Patients Australia commenced a project aimed to understand patient experiences and collect information about their unique needs to inform the delivery of dedicated support and information. Engaging with patients as partners, this project led to the development of national, nurse-led, patient-centred support and advocacy for patients living with mucosal melanoma.



### Method

- Data collection of patient-reported unmet needs and unique concerns
- Identification of the nursing care requirements, support and information needs for patients living with mucosal melanoma
- Scoping of existing support and information services



### Outcome

The project outcomes were:

- Identification of the unique physiological, psychological, and practical concerns faced by patients with mucosal melanoma
- Facilitated virtual peer support group for patients with mucosal melanoma
- Dedicated support and information from a specialist melanoma nurse
- Engaging with stakeholders to advocate for mucosal melanoma patients

### Melanoma Patients Australia have since committed to:

- Tailoring the telehealth nurse service to meet the unique needs identified
- A monthly virtual mucosal melanoma support group
- New dedicated rare melanoma website information.
- Advocating for this rare type of melanoma

The Mucosal Melanoma Support Group has made its participants feel validated, heard and not so isolated. It is a lonely road due to its rarity and it's difficult to find Doctors experienced in treating it. Our Nurse is leading the way in raising awareness on our behalf.
